The street address is 1037 Blagen Road in Arnold. It is between the Post Office and the Library on Blagen. To reach it you come up (or down) Hwy #4 into Arnold. When you reach the Chevron Station on the left hand side (coming up), you make a gentle left turn onto Blagen Road, which will take you past Ace Hardware and the Post Office. The Station is on the left hand side and is the big building full of Fire Engines if they are not out on a call. A tip from MacWorld, August 2011

To extract a single page (or a set of pages) from a pdf document

Open the pdf document.

Make sure the sidebar shows: that is the document pages are displayed as thumbnails. If not, press apple(command)/option/2.

In the sidebar, click the thumbnail of the page you want to extract and drag it to your desktop. Preview will now create a new file with just that page, giving it the same name as the original file but with (*dragged*) as its suffix.

If you command-click to select multiple (even non-contiguous) pages from the sidebar and drag them all to the desktop, you'll create a single new pdf containing all of them.
