From Norm Milsner:

If messages disappeared from mailboxes

If all the messages in a mailbox have disappeared and are missing, it's possible the mailbox contains too many messages and attachments. This can happen with mailboxes whose sizes range from hundreds of megabytes to more. Although you can't see your messages, they're still in the mailbox.

Here are ways to redisplay the messages:

If you have multiple email accounts, view the inbox for each account separately, instead of viewing the Inbox mailbox. The Inbox mailbox displays messages from all of your accounts, and all of those messages
